

Bromma Stockholm Airport is *Airport Carbon Accredited*



In recognition of our environmental programme to reduce and eliminate CO₂ emissions from airport operations, several Swedavia Airports, including Bromma Stockholm became *Airport Carbon Accredited* at the highest possible level ('Neutrality') in 2010 and again in 2011.

Airport Carbon Accreditation is the European standard for carbon management and reduction at airports. It is independent and institutionally-endorsed. The programme has 4 levels of accreditation – 'Mapping', 'Reduction', 'Optimisation' and 'Neutrality'.

Our accreditation at the 'Neutrality' level means that not only has our airport mapped and reduced the CO₂ emissions under its direct control, but also that we have engaged other stakeholders on the airport site (airlines, ground handlers, retailers, passengers) to reduce their CO₂ emissions as well. Finally, any outstanding CO₂ emissions under our direct control have been offset.

To date, 8 airports in Europe have achieved certification at the 'Neutrality' level of *Airport Carbon Accreditation*. Swedavia operates 4 of those airports: Arlanda, Bromma, Gotenborg Landvetter and Umea City.
